ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

Before the Commission is a Letter Petition of the Metropolitan Edison Company (Met-Ed)/ Pennsylvania Electric Company (Penelec) Sustainable Energy Fund (Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF), dated October 11, 2022, for approval of a nominee to the Advisory Board. Commission approval of the proposed Board Members is required under the Met-Ed and Penelec restructuring settlement. *Applications of Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company for Approval of Restructuring Plan under Section 2806 of the Public Utility Code*, Docket Nos. R-00974008 and R-00974009 (Order entered October 20, 1998). Commission approval of the proposed Board members is also required by the Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF's governing bylaws. *Metropolitan Edison*

Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company Sustainable Energy Fund Bylaws, Docket Nos. R-00974008 and R-00974009 (Order entered April 27, 2000).

On October 20, 1998, at Docket Nos. R-00974008 and R-00974009, the Commission approved Joint Petitions for Full Settlement of the restructuring proceedings filed by Met-Ed and Penelec pursuant to the requirements of the Electricity Generation Customer Choice and Competition Act, 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 2801-2812. Among the provisions of the approved settlement was the establishment of a Sustainable Energy Fund to promote (1) the development and use of renewable energy and clean energy technologies, (2) energy conservation and efficiency, and (3) renewable business initiatives and projects that improve the environment in the companies' service territories. On June 4, 1999, the Commission approved the Advisory Board for the Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF. On April 27, 2000, the Commission approved the bylaws for the Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF. The approval of the bylaws allowed the SEF to begin operations to promote the development of and use of renewable and clean energy technologies in Pennsylvania.

The Advisory Board of the Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF voted on May 20, 2022, to approve the nomination of Christopher Wehr to the Board. Mr. Wehr holds the position of Staff Business Analyst – Energy Efficiency Compliance & Reporting at FirstEnergy Corporation (FirstEnergy) and will represent the FirstEnergy Utility position on the Advisory Board. The Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF requests that the Commission approve the nomination of Mr. Wehr.

Mr. Wehr has worked at FirstEnergy, where he has held various leadership positions in several areas of the company, for over 33 years. Mr. Wehr has an Associate Degree in Electrical Engineering Technology from Pennsylvania State University and an Associate Degree in Specialized Electronics Technology from

the Lincoln Technical Institute. Mr. Wehr participates in industry organizations such as the Electric Power & Research Institute, the Peak Load Management Association, and the Association of Energy Service Professionals. Mr. Wehr is a resident of Richfield, Ohio.

In keeping with the intent of the *Best Practices for the Regional Sustainable Energy Funds: Guidelines for the Nomination, Election and Approval of Directors*, the Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF sent out notice of the Advisory Board vacancy and put notice of Advisory Board vacancy on their respective websites.

Based on a review of all relevant information, we find this nominee to be well-qualified to serve on the Advisory Board of the Met-Ed/ Penelec SEF;

THEREFORE,


IT IS ORDERED:
