NAME AND SUBJECT: JOHN KERR MUSGRAVE IV VS PITTSBURGH WATER AND SEWER AUTHORITY

Formal Complaint (FC) filed on 7/8/20, regarding quality of service. Complainant alleges that: (1) the water provided by Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority (PWSA) to the service address was unsafe due to low chlorine levels; (2) PWSA has wrongfully refused to replace the service line serving the service address under the baseless contention that it is a private line; and, as such, (3) the Complainant and his affected neighbors are forced to pay for their own water line repairs on a service line that experiences frequent breaks. As relief, the Complainant requested that PWSA build a new water service line to his service address, which supplies water containing appropriate chlorine levels. On 7/19/23, the Commission issued the Initial Decision (ID) of ALJ Dunderdale, which sustained the FC, in part, and denied it, in part, finding that PWSA failed to provide reliable, safe, and quality water service to the Complainant’s service address by failing to provide reasonable and adequate maintenance and repair services between 5/2018 and 11/2020, and by unreasonably replacing and relocating the Complainant’s curb stop and service line. On 8/8/23, PWSA and the Complainant filed Exceptions to the ALJ’s ID. The Complainant filed Reply Exceptions on 8/18/23.

Supplement No. 71 to Tariff Electric Pa. P.U.C. No. 25 filed on 3/20/24, to become effective 5/20/24, containing proposed changes in rates, rules, and regulations calculated to produce a general increase in electric distribution rates of approximately \$133 million. Due to the proposed base rate increase including \$32 million of revenues currently recovered under surcharges, the increase to customers over current charges is \$101 million (15.9%). As proposed, the total bill for an average residential customer using 600 kWh is increasing from \$130.67 to \$139.19/month (6.52%). On 3/22/24, the Office of Consumer Advocate filed a Formal Complaint.
