The Commission finds that it is necessary to revise these regulations to comply with Act 129 of 2008, Act 35 of 2007, and to clarify certain issues of law, administrative procedure and policy. These proposed revisions are being issued for public comment. RECOMMENDATION: That the Commission adopt the proposed Rulemaking Order.
