In her Initial Decision, issued on 10/24/13, ALJ Vero concluded that the Complainant had failed to carry his burden of proving that PGW had improperly held him responsible for the unauthorized use of gas at the service address. The ALJ recommended that the Complaint be denied. No Party filed timely Exceptions to the Initial Decision and it became the Commission's final action on 11/13/13. On 11/27/13, the Complainant filed a Petition for Reconsideration but apparently did not serve it on PGW. PGW filed an Answer to the Petition on 2/24/14. RECOMMENDATION: That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order, which denies the Petition.
