By Order entered on 2/28/13, the Commission dismissed a complaint filed against PAWC, at Docket No. C-2011-2226096, that alleged that PAWC was prohibited from billing DSIC on a "bills-rendered" basis. On the basis of the result in that proceeding, Aqua filed a Motion for Summary Judgment in the instant proceeding on 5/7/13. On 5/24/13, the Complainants filed a Brief in Opposition. In his Initial Decision, ALJ Johnson concluded that no genuine issue of material fact was presented. As such, the ALJ recommended that Aqua's Motion be granted and that the Complaint be dismissed. The Complainants filed Exceptions to the Initial Decision and Aqua filed Reply Exceptions.

To accomplish the Commission's objective, the Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking Order proposes for comment the application of a symmetrical rate of interest to both over and under collections resulting from the reconciliation of utilities' costs and revenues collected through automatic adjustment clauses regarding electric default service.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking Order.

The surcharge is to offset significant undercollections in their GSSR created by the extraordinarily cold weather in 1/14. The weather caused increases in PJM spot prices and congestion charges far in excess of projections. By Order dated 3/20/14, the Commission suspended the rate filings for six months. On 4/15/14, the parties filed a Joint Petition for Settlement.
