- Complaint filed on 2/27/13, alleging he had paid PECO more than what the company alleges and that his bills are very high. On 3/22/13, the Complainant amended his Complaint to add a claim that PECO was threatening to terminate service. On 3/28/13, PECO filed an Answer and denied the allegations and averred that the Complainant had been properly billed. PECO stated that the account was a commercial account and not eligible for a Commission issued payment arrangement, that the Complainant had defaulted on a payment agreement, and that he had been unresponsive to requests to schedule a high bill investigation. At the beginning of the hearing, the Complainant requested the services of a Mandingo interpreter. The ALJ continued the hearing in order to address the request. The hearing convened without an interpreter as one was unavailable. In an Initial Decision, issued 1/7/14, ALJ Vero dismissed the Complaint. The Complainant filed Exceptions and PECO filed Replies to Exceptions.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order which denies the Exceptions of the Complainant and adopts the Initial Decision.

The Answer averred that the Complainant's bills were correct as rendered and that her high bill concerns had been investigated. PECO requested that the Complaint be dismissed. On 11/26/13, ALJ Salapa issued an Initial Decision in which he found that the Complainant's bills were correct as rendered and dismissed the Complaint. The Complainant filed Exceptions and PECO filed Replies to Exceptions. In an Order entered 4/3/14, the Commission found that the Complainant had failed to meet her burden of proof, denied the Exceptions, and adopted the Initial Decision. The Complainant filed a Petition for Rescission on 4/28/14 and PECO filed an Answer on 4/30/14.
