ALEXANDER SMITH VS PHILADELPHIA GAS WORKS

- Complaint filed 7/9/12 alleging that there were incorrect charges on his bill, that PGW had falsely accused him of stealing gas and that he was using a gas water heater and range. He requested, inter alia, that an investigator visit his residence, and that he be provided with an analysis of his gas usage. PGW filed an Answer denying that there were incorrect charges on the bill or that it had falsely reported a gas range and water heater were on the fuel line. PGW stated that on 11/15/11, a Company technician was at the service address investigating a gas leak in the street and discovered that the Complainant's meter had a bypass and that a house heater, water heater, and gas range were all attached to the meter. PGW stated that it had billed the Complainant bypass charges in the amount of \$6,443. In an Initial Decision, the ALJ granted the Complaint in part and denied it in part. Both Parties filed Exceptions on 4/3/14 and Replies on 4/14/14.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order which grants the Exceptions of the Complainant, in part; denies the Exceptions of PGW; and modifies the Initial Decision.

In its Preliminary Objections, Columbia argued that the Commission lacks jurisdiction to award damages and that the Complaint should be dismissed for legal insufficiency. On 4/3/14, the Complainant filed a response to the Preliminary Objections. On 4/11/14, the ALJ issued a Decision granting the Preliminary Objections and dismissing the Complaint. Exceptions were filed by the Complainant and Replies were filed by Columbia.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order which grants, in part, the Exceptions of the Complainant; modifies the Initial Decision; and remands this proceeding to the Office of Administrative Law Judge.
