On 1/16/14, PPL filed separate Answers to the Complaints denying the material allegations set forth therein. An evidentiary hearing was held on 8/12/14. PPLICA filed a Main Brief on 9/9/14, PPL filed a Response Brief on 9/30/14, and PPLICA filed a Reply Brief on 10/14/14. On 12/24/14, the Commission issued the Recommended Decision of ALJ Colwell, which dismissed the Complaints. On 1/13/15, PPLICA filed Exceptions, and on 1/23/15, PPL filed Replies to the Exceptions. On 4/23/15, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order, which, inter alia, granted, in part, and denied, in part, the Exceptions. On 5/11/15, PPLICA filed a Petition for Reconsideration of the 4/23/15 Opinion and Order.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order, which grants reconsideration pending review of, and consideration on, the merits of the petition.
