RULEMAKING - PAPER BILLING FEES

- In an Opinion and Order entered 7/7/10, the Commission initiated an investigation into the practice of paper invoice charges. On 3/20/14, the Commission concluded the investigation issuing an Order finding that imposing a separate line item charge to recover the costs for the provision of monthly paper bills is not consistent with the Public Utility Code, Commission regulations, long-standing precedent, and well-established practices of PA public utilities. The Commission's 3/20/14 Order also directed Law Bureau to prepare a narrowly focused Notice of Proposed Rulemaking addressing the paper billing fee issue. On 12/4/14, the Commission issued a Proposed Rulemaking Order proposing to add Section 53.85 as a new section to Chapter 53. Comments were filed by various interested parties, including the IRRC. The Commission has reviewed those comments and issues this Final Rulemaking Order.

The PA Carrier Working Group (CWG) has considered the proposal and recommends its approval.
