VALLEY LIMOUSINE SERVICE LLC AND GLOBAL POINT TRANSPORTATION LLC

- On 10/25/12, the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) filed an Amended Complaint against Valley alleging that it failed to file assessment reports for the 2009 and 2010 calendar years. Also, I&E alleged that Valley failed to pay its assessments for the 7/1/10 to 6/30/11 and the 7/1/11 to 6/30/12 Fiscal Years. On 11/28/12, I&E filed a Motion for Default Judgment. By Order entered 4/18/13, the Motion was granted. Valley was given 30 days in which to make payment, or its certificate would be cancelled. On 3/7/14 Global entered into a Purchase Agreement with Valley. On 10/9/14, Valley filed an Application for Approval of Transfer. By Secretarial Letter issued on 2/12/15, the Commission cancelled Valley's certificate. By Secretarial Letter issued on 3/19/15, the Transfer Application was denied. On 4/2/15, Global filed a Petition for Reconsideration. On 2/16/16, Valley filed a Petition for Reinstatement for Purpose of Transfer. No responses to the Petitions have been filed.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order that grants the Petition for Reinstatement for Purpose of Transfer, grants the Petition for Reconsideration and refers the matter to the Bureau of Technical Utility Services for further action.

2393373-OSA F-2013-2393373 STEPHANIE HALLMAN VS PECO ENERGY COMPANY

- Formal Complaint filed on 11/8/13, alleging that PECO wanted her to pay for an unpaid utility account balance for service rendered to an address where she never lived and for which she was never responsible. Evidentiary proceedings were conducted, and on 7/15/14, an Initial Decision of ALJ Dunderdale was issued which recommended sustaining the Complaint and imposing a civil penalty upon PECO. PECO filed Exceptions. By Order of 4/9/15, the Commission directed a limited remand and the issuance of a Supplemental Initial Decision. On 6/25/15 the Supplemental Initial Decision was issued which sustained the Complaint and imposed a civil penalty. On 7/15/15, PECO filed Exceptions to the Supplemental Initial Decision.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order, which denies the Exceptions of PECO and adopts the Supplemental Initial Decision, as modified, consistent with the discussion.
