The Complaint requested a payment arrangement and alleged certain disputes with the billing format of PECO, medical certification, and termination procedures. On 8/4/15, PECO filed an Answer and New Matter, raising, inter alia, the prohibition against payment agreements that pertain to Customer Assistance Program (CAP) arrearages. The matter was thereafter assigned to ALJ Heep. An initial, in-person, hearing was scheduled and convened on 10/13/15, at which time the Complainants did not appear. On 11/25/15, the Initial Decision of ALJ Heep was issued which granted the oral motion of PECO and dismissed the Complaint, with prejudice, for failure of the Complainants to appear and prosecute.
