On 10/8/15, ALJ Dunderdale issued an Initial Decision that sustained, in part, and denied, in part, the Complaint. PAWC filed Exceptions on 8/28/15. No Replies to Exceptions were filed by the Complainant.

On 4/6/15, PPL filed an Answer denying the material allegations of the Complaint. A hearing was held on 6/26/15. In an Initial Decision issued on 10/26/15, ALJ Dunderdale sustained the Complaint, in part, pertaining to the claim of unreasonable service and assessed a civil penalty of \$2,000. PPL filed Exceptions on 11/16/15; no Replies to Exceptions were filed.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order granting the Exceptions, in part, and modifying the Initial Decision.

In an Initial Decision, issued 12/21/15, ALJ Fordham dismissed the Complaint, finding that the Complainant failed to sustain her burden of proof. The Complainant filed Exceptions on 12/26/15. On 3/10/16, PECO filed Replies to Exceptions, along with a Motion to File Replies to Exceptions Nunc Pro Tunc.

He requested that Blue Pilot provide evidence that his rate was variable or reduce his rate. On 9/10/15, Blue Pilot filed an Answer to the Complaint in which it averred, inter alia, that it was duly authorized to serve the Complainant as its electric generation supplier, that it properly billed the Complainant according to its variable rate plan, that it provided the Complainant all legal disclosures, and that it implemented legal and justified rate increases. ALJ Barnes held a telephonic evidentiary hearing on 11/20/15. The ALJ sustained the Complaint by Initial Decision issued 1/8/16. Blue Pilot filed Exceptions on 1/28/16; the Complainant did not file Replies to Exceptions.

ALJ Johnson scheduled and convened a telephonic hearing on 1/15/16, in which the Complainant did not participate. On 1/29/16, the Commission issued the ALJ's Initial Decision that dismissed the Formal Complaint for lack of prosecution. The Complainant filed Exceptions on 2/24/16. West Penn filed Reply Exceptions on 3/7/16.
