On 3/14/16, UGI filed Preliminary Objections, seeking dismissal of the City's Complaint. By Interim Order dated 3/29/16, ALJ Long denied the Preliminary Objections. On 9/1/16, UGI filed a Petition for Interlocutory Review and Answer to Material Question regarding whether the City Parties' Complaints should be dismissed on the basis that the requested relief is outside of the scope of a formal complaint proceeding. The City Parties filed a Brief in Opposition to the Petition on 9/9/16. UGI filed a Brief in Support of the Petition on 9/12/16. RECOMMENDATION: That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order which declines to answer the Material Questions presented in the petition and returns this matter to the OALJ.
