These regulations address the process for transferring a customer's account from a service of last resort (SOLR) provider to a competitive NGS, from one NGS to another NGS and from an NGS to SOLR service. The proposed regulatory changes are intended to accelerate this process while preserving safeguards to prevent the unauthorized switching of a customer's account, also known as "slamming." Comments were due and were filed on 2/21/17.
