On 7/13/17, EMS Southwest filed a Petition for Reconsideration from Staff Action relating to the Secretarial Letter. No Answer to the Petition has been filed.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order that grants the Petition, rescinds the Secretarial Letter, and refers this matter to the Bureau of Technical Utility Services for such further action as may be warranted.
