On 11/30/16, the Commission issued ALJ Heep's Initial Decision, which granted the Complaint, in part. On 12/20/16, PECO filed Exceptions to the ALJs' Initial Decision. No Replies to Exceptions were filed.  RECOMMENDATION:  That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order.

On 4/27/16, PGW filed an Answer to the Complaint, averring, among other things, that the Complainant is not entitled to a payment arrangement because she had defaulted on a prior payment arrangement established by the Commission's Bureau of Consumer Services. A hearing was held on 7/20/16. In the Initial Decision, issued 11/2/17, ALJ Guhl dismissed the Complaint, concluding that the Commission is constrained from providing the Complainant with another payment arrangement based on Section 1405(d) and (e) of the Public Utility Code. The Complainant filed Exceptions on 11/15/17, but did not serve PGW. By Secretarial Letter issued 2/13/18, the Complainant's Exceptions were transmitted to PGW. On 2/22/18, PGW filed Replies to Exceptions.  RECOMMENDATION:  That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order that denies the Exceptions and adopts the ALJ's Initial Decision as modified, consistent with the Opinion and Order.

- On 9/21/16, the Complainant filed a pleading styled “Application for Determination as to Compensation for Damages Sustained Due to Abolition of Railroad Crossing,” pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 2704(a). The filing was treated as a Formal Complaint and assigned to ALJ Salapa. Complainant alleges the value of his property decreased because of a Commission Order at Docket No. C-2011-2237486, et al., that directed the abolition of a rail crossing and bridge (S.R. 4009) which bisected his property. ALJ Salapa requested motions for summary judgment from the parties (Norfolk Southern, PennDOT, Lackawanna County and LaPlume Twp.). On 4/21/17, upon consideration of the motions for summary judgment, the ALJ Recommended Decision granting the Norfolk Southern and PennDOT motions for summary judgment was issued. The ALJ recommended that the Complaint be dismissed. Exceptions were filed by the Complainant. Motions to strike the Exceptions and Replies to the Exceptions were filed by certain parties.
