The investigation related to allegations that AP&G engaged in deceptive marketing practices by misrepresenting its status as an EGS and its purpose, speaking to individuals who lacked authority to enroll accounts, and engaging in questionable marketing practices in 2015. On 4/6/17, the parties submitted a Joint Petition for Settlement and Statements in Support of the Settlement. By Order entered 3/1/18, the Commission issued the Settlement for comments. No comments were filed.
