- Supplement No. 5 to Tariff Water-Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 filed on 10/30/17, proposing a general rate increase to increase its annual operating revenues by \$236,829 or 45.5%, to become effective 1/1/18. Upon the filing of various Formal Complaints, the matter was suspended by operation of law until 8/1/18, and assigned to the OALJ. On 1/2/18, a Prehearing Order was issued, which consolidated the Formal Complaints. On 2/2/18, Reynolds agreed to further suspend Supplement No. 5 until 10/1/18, to provide time for the mediation process. On 4/16/18, Reynolds, the OCA and the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) filed a Joint Petition for Settlement. - On 4/25/18, Senator Dinniman filed a Formal Complaint, subsequently amended, and Petition seeking interim emergency relief against Sunoco raising issues of public safety concerning the operation of the Mariner East (ME) pipeline, ME1, and the construction of ME2 and ME2X pipelines. On 5/24/18, an Interim Emergency Order and Certification of Material Question of ALJ Barnes was issued and the procedures for interim emergency relief were followed. On 6/15/18 the Commission affirmed, in part, and reversed, in part, the Interim Emergency Order. The 6/15/18 Order provided Sunoco the opportunity to provide certain documents for the consideration of the Commission in order to lift that portion of interim emergency relief which was granted. On 6/22/18; 7/3/18, and 7/18/18, Sunoco filed documents responsive to the 6/15/18 Order. Responses were filed by Senator Dinniman and the Clean Air Council.

Amendments to the Complaint and Petition were filed 4/30/18. On 5/24/18, ALJ Barnes issued the Interim Emergency Order and Certification of Material Question. By Order entered 6/15/18, the Commission reversed, in part, and affirmed, in part, the Interim Emergency Order. On 6/25/18, Sunoco filed a Motion for Certification of the 6/15/18 Order for Interlocutory Appeal. Senator Dinniman filed an Answer opposing the Motion on 7/6/18. An Opinion and Order granting the Motion, in part, and denying it, in part, was adopted by a majority of the Commission through a notational vote taken on 7/20/18, and served on 7/25/18. RECOMMENDATION: That, consistent with 4 Pa. Code § 1.43(c), this action be recorded and entered in the minutes of this public meeting.
