- Formal Complaint and Petition for Emergency Relief filed on 11/19/18, opposing the operation and/or construction associated with Sunoco pipelines Mariner East 1 (ME1), Mariner East 2 (ME2) and Mariner East 2X (ME2X). Hearings were held on 11/29-11/30/18. ALJ Barnes issued an Interim Emergency Order on 12/11/18 denying the emergency relief and certifying a material question for Commission disposition.

### RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order.
