Application for a certificate of public convenience to acquire the water assets of the Steelton Borough Authority (Steelton) was filed on 1/2/19. By data request dated 1/9/19, the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services (TUS) identified missing information in the Application and requested supplemental responses. On 1/14/19, PAWC filed responses to TUS's data requests. By Secretarial Letter dated 1/17/19, TUS conditionally accepted the filing of the Application. On 1/24/19, the Office of Consumer Advocate filed a Petition for Appeal of Staff Action and/or a Determination of Finality (Petition). PAWC filed an Answer to the Petition on 1/28/19. On 2/4/19, Steelton filed an Answer to the Petition.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order.
