**PETITION FOR LEAVE TO WITHDRAW THE PETITION TO INTERVENE OF THE
ENVIRONMENTAL INTEGRITY PROJECT**

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.94(a), the Environmental Integrity Project (“EIP” or “Petitioner”), by its undersigned counsel, hereby petitions for leave to withdraw its previously-granted Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned proceedings. In support of this Petition, EIP states as follows:

1. On March 21, 2014, Sunoco Pipeline, L.P. (“Sunoco”), filed an initial petition with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) in furtherance of its project to reconfigure an existing pipeline and build a number of pump stations and valve stations. The petition sought a finding from the Commission pursuant to Section 619 of the Municipalities Planning Code exempting Sunoco’s project from local zoning ordinances in thirty-one municipalities across Pennsylvania.

2. On May 8, 2014, Sunoco filed the above-captioned thirty-one amended petitions with the Commission requesting this exemption (“Amended Petitions”).

3. EIP filed a Protest in this matter on June 9, 2014, and a Petition to Intervene in this matter on June 10, 2014. Prehearing Order #1, dated December 1, 2014, granted EIP's Petition to Intervene.

4. Following its intervention, EIP has actively reviewed the filings and orders made to date and has discussed these internally and with other parties.

5. While EIP continues to harbor concerns regarding Sunoco's proposed project and its petitions, the press of other matters that have developed since EIP's intervention will not allow EIP to participate fully in this matter. EIP believes that other intervenors in this matter will adequately address EIP's concerns in regard to Sunoco's project and petitions. For these reasons, EIP seeks to withdraw its Petition to Intervene.

6. Granting this Petition and thus allowing EIP to discontinue its participation in this matter will conserve party and Commission resources and therefore is in the public interest.
