JOINT STATUS REPORT OF THE BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION AND ENFORCEMENT AND LYFT, INC.

TO ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGES MARY D. LONG AND JEFFREY A. WATSON:

Pursuant to Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of the January 15, 2015 Interim Order on Second Motion for a Continuance, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's (Commission) Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) and Lyft, Inc. (Lyft) respectfully submit this joint status report regarding the status of settlement discussions and hereby present three alternative hearing dates in the above-captioned Complaint proceeding.

- 1. On January 13, 2015, Lyft filed an Unopposed Motion for Continuance of the Initial Hearing in this proceeding, which had been scheduled for February 19, 2015. Part of the rationale for the continuance was to allow the parties to continue to engage in settlement discussions in an attempt to avoid the need for the Initial Hearing altogether.
- 2. By Interim Order entered on January 15, 2015, the evidentiary hearing scheduled for February 19, 2015 was cancelled. The Interim Order also directed the parties to submit a joint status report on or before February 20, 2015 detailing the status of their settlement discussions and providing three alternate hearing dates in March.
- 3. The parties have been actively engaged in settlement discussions concerning a potential resolution of this matter since the beginning of 2015. Specifically, the parties participated in an in-person settlement meeting on January 8, 2015 in Harrisburg, PA. The parties exchanged written

proposals and counter-proposals on the following dates: January 13, 2015, January 22, 2015 and February 11, 2015. Further, the parties held telephonic discussions pertaining to settlement on January 29, 2015, February 6, 2015 and February 13, 2015. The parties are in the process of scheduling another telephonic settlement discussion for either the last week of February 2015 or the first week of March 2015. The parties are hopeful that they will achieve a settlement that fully resolves this matter.

4. Should an evidentiary hearing be necessary, I&E and Lyft propose the following three hearing dates in March 2015, in order of preference, in which counsel and witnesses would be available for an in-person hearing in Pittsburgh: March 31, March 30 and March 20.
