**Re: Request For Negotiation of Interconnection Agreement**

To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to Sections 251 and 252 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended ("the Act"), IDT America Corp., on behalf of itself and its affiliates ("IDT"), hereby requests negotiation of an interconnection and reciprocal compensation agreement with Commonwealth Telephone Company ("Commonwealth"). Pursuant to Section 252 (b) of the Act, either party may file a petition seeking arbitration with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to resolve any disputed issues should the parties not come to agreement on the rates, terms, and conditions of an interconnection agreement. Such a petition may be filed during the period between the 135th and 160 day, inclusive, after the date of your receipt of this request.

The Interconnection arrangement sought by IDT will cover all intraLATA telecommunications traffic exchanged directly or indirectly between the parties. Furthermore, the agreement will provide reciprocal compensation terms for the transport and termination of that traffic, in accordance with Section 251(b)(5) of the Act.

To the extent you contend that the rural exemption afforded by 47 U.S.C. § 251(f)(1) is at issue, please be advised that this letter is a bona fide request for interconnection pursuant to §§ 251 (f)(1)(A) and (B) of the Act. As required by the Pennsylvania PUC's rules, we are simultaneously filing a copy of this request with the PUC. Pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 251 (f)(1)(B), this filing begins the 120-day period for determining whether the exemption should be terminated. If, however, you do not intend to invoke and rely on the rural exemption under §251 (f)(1)(A) of the Act, please confirm as such in writing so that we can notify the PUC that the rural exemption is not at issue and that there is no need to make a determination pursuant to 47 U.S.C. § 251 (f)(1)(B).


