
Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

In accordance with the Order entered on June 11, 2015 under the above-referenced docket number ("Order"), Pike County Light & Power Company ("PCL&P" or the "Company") was directed to file with the Commission annual status update reports and any other status updates as necessary due to the promulgation of off-cycle supplier switching regulations by the New York State Public Service Commission ("NYPSC"). PCL&P hereby submits the update set forth below.

By order dated December 15, 2014 ("December NYPSC Order"), the NYPSC directed its Staff to lead a collaborative to consider the development of proposals to effectuate off-cycle switching for both gas and electricity.<sup>1</sup> The NYPSC directed that the first meeting of the collaborative be convened within 45 days of the December NYPSC Order and that it culminate in a report identifying changes recommended by the collaborative, to be submitted to the NYPSC by August 31, 2015.<sup>2</sup> On July 24, 2015, the collaborative filed its report with the NYPSC ("Report").<sup>3</sup> For a number of reasons, and in particular due to the absence of Advanced Metering Infrastructure ("AMI") in New York, the Report recommends that off-cycle switching not be implemented at this time. The Report goes on to note that the consensus of the collaborative was that off-cycle switching be considered further only after AMI has been deployed to a majority of customers in any utility service territory.
