# PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF THE WEST PENN POWER INDUSTRIAL INTERVENORS

Pursuant to Administrative Law Judge ("ALJ") Mary D. Long's June 9, 2016, Prehearing Conference Order, the West Penn Power Industrial Intervenors ("WPPII") hereby submit this Prehearing Memorandum in the above-captioned proceeding.

#### I. HISTORY OF THE PROCEEDING

On April 28, 2016, West Penn Power Company ("West Penn" or "Company") filed with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission" or "PUC") its Supplement No. 10 to Tariff Electric Pa. P.U.C. No. 38 and Supplement No. 15 to Tariff Electric - Pa. P.U.C. No. 40, proposed to become effective on June 27, 2016. Through this filing, West Penn requested a distribution rate increase of \$98.2 million and a proposed Return on Equity ("ROE") of 10.9%. In addition, West Penn proposed minor changes to the rate design for Large Commercial and Industrial ("C&I") customers in its service territory, specifically for Schedule 44 and 46 customers, including, among other things, modifications to West Penn's demand charge, voltage discount, and energy charge.

Proposed Supplement No. 10 to Tariff Electric – Pa. P.U.C. No. 38 applies only to the University Park campus of the Pennsylvania State University. Proposed Supplement No. 15 is applicable throughout West Penn's service area.

On June 6, 2016, WPPII filed a Complaint to West Penn's filing. A description of WPPII is set forth in Paragraph 6 of its Complaint.

A Prehearing Conference has been scheduled in this proceeding for June 17, 2016.

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III. ANTICIPATED ISSUES AND SUB-ISSUES

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WPPII's preliminary review of West Penn's filing indicates the need for Commission investigation into at least the following issues:

- (a) whether the size of West Penn's requested rate increase is appropriate;
- (b) whether the expenses claimed by West Penn were prudently incurred;
- (c) whether the allocation of the proposed distribution rate increase between and among West Penn's customer classes is just, reasonable, and non-discriminatory;
- (d) whether West Penn's proposed rate structure and rate design is appropriate;
- (e) whether the 10.9% return on equity proposed by West Penn results in a fair rate of return;
- (f) whether West Penn's claimed costs of service are accurate, legitimate, and appropriately allocated;

(g) whether implementation of the proposed changes to West Penn's rules and riders are appropriate and lawful; and,

(h) whether West Penn's proposed tariff changes result in unjust and unreasonable service for customers.

WPPII anticipates pursuing these issues during this proceeding and also reserves the right to raise further issues and to respond to all matters raised by other parties.

WPPII will cooperate with the ALJ and the parties at the Prehearing Conference to develop

a protective order in accordance with the Commission's regulations and any directives issued by

the ALJ.

VIII. POSSIBILITY OF SETTLEMENT

WPPII is willing to participate in discussions with the other parties to amicably resolve the

issues in this proceeding.
