PREHEARING MEMORANDUM OF THE OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE

Pursuant to the Prehearing Conference Order of Administrative Law Judge Jeffrey A. Watson dated June 24, 2016, Section 333 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 333, and in anticipation of the Prehearing Conference scheduled for July 1, 2016, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) provides the following information:

I. INTRODUCTION

On April 29, 2016, Peoples Natural Gas Company LLC and Peoples Natural Gas Company LLC – Equitable Division (jointly, Peoples or Companies) filed Supplements¹ to their Tariffs with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) seeking approval to

Peoples Natural Gas Company LLC filed Supplement No. 69 to Tariff Gas - PA PUC No. 45. Peoples Natural Gas Company LLC – Equitable Division filed Supplement No. 38 to Tariff Gas - PA PUC No. 46.

eliminate their pilot programs entitled Rider Service Expansion Tariffs (Rider SET) and replace it with Rate MLX.

Currently, under the Rider SET pilot programs, residential applicants for gas service who request an extension of the Companies' facilities to serve their home have the option to pay \$55.00 per month over a period of up to twenty-five (25) years in lieu of an upfront Contribution in Aid of Construction (CIAC) payment, as is the usual practice in Pennsylvania. Rider SET was intended to reduce the financial barriers faced by consumers seeking natural gas service in areas where natural gas is currently unavailable. Rate MLX, if approved, would allow customers to pay higher delivery charges instead of a CIAC paid as an upfront lump payment or as a monthly surcharge (i.e., Rider SET).

The OCA filed a Formal Complaint and Public Statement in this proceeding on May 26, 2016, to help ensure that the proposed Rate MLX contains adequate consumer protections and does not result in rates and charges that are excessive, unjust or unreasonable, discriminatory, or otherwise contrary to Commission regulation or policy. The Office of Small Business Advocate filed a Formal Complaint and Public Statement on May 16, 2016. The Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement (I&E) filed a Notice of Appearance on May 18, 2016.

On June 9, 2016, the Commission suspended the filing until December 28, 2016, and assigned the case to the Office of Administrative Law Judge. This proceeding was further assigned to Administrative Law Judge Jeffrey A. Watson. On June 24, 2016, ALJ Watson issued a Prehearing Conference Order indicating that an Initial Prehearing Conference is scheduled for July 1, 2016. The OCA submits this Prehearing Memorandum in accordance with the Prehearing Conference Order in this matter.

II. **ISSUES AND SUB-ISSUES**

Based upon a preliminary analysis of the Company's proposed Rate MLX, the OCA has

compiled a list of issues and sub-issues, which it anticipates will be included in its investigation

of the Company's proposal. The OCA anticipates that other issues may arise and may be

pursued as responses to interrogatories are received and analyzed.

The following list sets forth issues the OCA anticipates it may raise:

(1) Reasonableness of the calculation of Rate MLX;

Compliance of the Company's calculations and supporting data with the Public (2)

Utility Code, Commission regulations and general ratemaking principles; and

The inclusion of adequate customer protections for both new and existing (3)

customers.

The OCA reserves the right to raise additional issues as discovery proceeds.

III. WITNESSES

The OCA intends to present the direct, rebuttal, and surrebuttal testimonies, as may be

necessary, of Glenn A. Watkins in this proceeding. Mr. Watkins will present testimony in

written form and will also attach various exhibits, documents, and explanatory information that

will assist in the presentation of the OCA's case. In order to expedite the resolution of this

proceeding, the OCA requests that hard copies of all interrogatories, testimony, and answers to

VI. PUBLIC INPUT HEARINGS

At present, the OCA has not received any requests for a public input hearing in this proceeding. If consumer interest arises, the OCA will make prompt notification to the ALJ and other parties to this proceeding.

VII. DISCOVERY

The OCA proposes that the following modifications to the rules of discovery be adopted:

1. The response period for replying to written interrogatories, requests for production and requests for admissions is ten (10) calendar days of receipt, unless

- otherwise indicated. Responses may be served electronically but hard copies must follow by first-class mail.
- 2. Objections to interrogatories, requests for production and requests for admissions are to be communicated orally to the propounder within three (3) calendar days of receipt and in writing within five (5) calendar day of receipt. The parties are directed to confer, by telephone or email, and attempt to resolve the objections.
- 3. Motions to dismiss objections and compel responses shall be filed and served on the ALJ and other parties within three (3) calendar days of receipt of the written objections. Answers to such motions shall be filed and served within three (3) calendar days after filing of the motion.
- 4. Interrogatories, requests for production and requests for admissions which are objected to but which are not made the subject of a motion to compel will be deemed withdrawn.
- 5. Interrogatories, motions to compel and responses are to be served electronically as well as on paper.
- 6. Responses to requests for document production, entry for inspection or other purposes shall be served in-hand within ten (10) calendar days.
- 7. Any discovery, objection or motion served after 12:00 p.m. on a Friday or the day before a holiday recognized by the Commission will be deemed to have been served on the following business day for purposes of tracking due dates.

VIII. SETTLEMENT

The OCA will participate fully in all settlement discussions.
