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PREHEARING CONFERENCE MEMORANDUM OF THE RETAIL ENERGY SUPPLY ASSOCIATION

NOW COMES The Retail Energy Supply Association, ("RESA") by and through its counsel, Hawke McKeon & Sniscak, LLP, and hereby provides the Honorable Presiding Administrative Law Judges with its Prehearing Conference Memorandum as required by the Deputy Chief Administrative Law Judge Christopher P. Pell and Administrative Law Judge Marta Guhl's ("ALJs") Prehearing Conference Order dated March 17, 2017. RESA states as follows:

I. ACCEPTANCE OF SERVICE

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II. DISCOVERY

2. RESA expects to engage in the discovery process and as of the date of the Prehearing Conference will have served at least one set of interrogatories. RESA attempt to be as expeditious as possible in conducting discovery and will do so in conformance with the Commission's regulations in that regard, however, RESA does not believe that a formal plan of discovery is needed. RESA is aware that the Office of Consumer Advocate typically suggests modifications to the Commission's discovery regulations for cases such as this and it does not object to those additional requirements.

III. SETTLEMENT

3. RESA commits to working with all parties in an effort to achieve a reasonable settlement of some or all of the issues in this matter.

IV. ISSUES

4. The issues that RESA presently intends to address are: 1) PGW's proposed modifications to interruptible service and rates; 2) other operational issues; 3) the current POR discount and 4) alternative methods of recovering the costs of the POR program while continuing to recover the costs associated with billing system improvements, customer education and other competitive enhancements that presently are recovered through the POR discount. This is not an exhaustive list and RESA reserves the right to address additional issues as appropriate.

V. WITNESSES

RESA intends to present the testimony of two witnesses. Randy Mangioni will
present testimony on operational issues and Anthony Cusati, III, will present testimony on POR
related subjects.

VI. HEARING TIME

6. RESA would suggest that three days should be sufficient to allow for hearings where written testimony is presented for the record and parties are able to cross examine witnesses.

VII. SCHEDULE

7. RESA participated in a call at which time a schedule was agreed-to by all parties.
