
Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

As a lifetime resident, I have very definite concerns about this project. In as much as it offers zero benefit to Franklin County, but carries major concerns. I would like to protest for the following reasons:

- Reduces tax base for my township, town, school district. Construction will damage local roads, repair of which will be passed on to local residents.
- Construction of line passes on to rate payers and will increase our electric bill.
- People will be forced to sell their ROW against their wishes. Most cannot afford the Eminent Domain lawyers who could assure that they get just compensation.
- Excavation will damage good farm land.
- Drilling for monopoles could affect water table, affecting local wells (both domestic and agricultural, and springs).
- High Voltage power lines have not been proven to be safe to reside near.
- The destruction of the viewshed and the "undeveloped" rural character of our valley will hurt the agri-tourism business in Franklin County.

In the interest of full disclosure, it is imperative that you make site visits and hold hearings in Franklin County.
