PETITION FOR LEAVE TO LATE FILE A PROTEST

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.43, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) respectfully requests a waiver of the Commission's requirements at 52 Pa. Code § 5.53 regarding the time of filing for protests.

1. On January 16, 2018, Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. (Aqua) and the Borough of Phoenixville (Phoenixville) filed a Joint Application with the Public Utility Commission (Commission) for approval of the acquisition by Aqua of the water system assets of Phoenixville in East Pikeland and Schuylkill Townships, Chester County and in Upper Providence Township,

Montgomery County and the right of Aqua to serve and Phoenixville to abandon public water service in those areas.

- 2. On January 27, 2018, Notice of the filing was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin with a due date for protests and petitions to intervene of February 12, 2018.
- 3. On February 12, 2018, the Bureau of Technical Utility Services (TUS) served discovery on Aqua, raising questions *inter alia* regarding a 10-year Water Supply Agreement between Phoenixville and Aqua. The Water Supply Agreement is attached to the Application as Exhibit Gl and the Application asks the Commission to approve this contract pursuant to 66 Pa. C.S. § 507.
- 4. Also on February 12, 2018, Pennsylvania-American Water Company (PAWC) filed a Protest, wherein it raised concerns regarding the Water Supply Agreement, which contains a partial assignment of rights and obligations under a 1986 Water Supply Agreement between Phoenixville and Citizen Utilities Home Water Company (Citizens). PAWC is the successor in rights and obligations of Citizens. PAWC also raised questions whether the service territory at issue overlaps with PAWC's existing certificated territory and whether some of the assets proposed to be acquired may be owned by PAWC rather than Phoenixville.
- 4. By this Petition, the OCA seeks leave to file its Protest on February 16, 4 days late. The OCA submits that the 4-day period by which this protest is late is not prejudicial to any party. As a Protest has already been filed by another party (PAWC), the matter will be assigned to the Office of Administrative Law Judge. Thus, the OCA's Protest will not affect the procedural posture of the case. To date, no procedural schedule has been determined.

5. As noted in the attached Protest, the OCA protests the granting of the Application at this time because TUS and PAWC have raised issues that bear on the reasonableness of the proposed transaction and, specifically, the impact of the proposed transaction on the service and rates of the customers proposed to be acquired by Aqua and PAWC's existing customers. The record should be developed on these issues to allow the Commission to determine whether the transaction is in the public interest.

WHEREFORE, the Office of Consumer Advocate respectfully requests leave to file the attached Protest.
