COMMENTS OF PENNSYLVANIA-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

On June 28, 2018, Governor Wolf signed into law Act 58 of 2018, which amends Chapter 13 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code ("Code"), 66 Pa.C.S. §§ 1301 et seq. (relating to rates and distribution systems). Specifically, Act 58 adds Section 1330, 66 Pa.C.S. § 1330 (relating to alternative ratemaking for utilities), that permits the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission ("Commission") to approve an application by a utility to establish alternative rates and rate mechanisms.

On August 23, 2018, the Commission issued a Tentative Implementation Order ("Tentative Order") seeking written comments on the proposed implementation of Section 1330 of the Code. Pennsylvania-American Water Company ("Pennsylvania American" or "PAWC") appreciates the opportunity provided by the Commission to submit written comments to the Tentative Order.

II. <u>COMMENTS</u>

A. Section 1330(a) – Declaration of Policy

Pennsylvania American agrees with the Commission's position to consider all policy goals provided for in law and regulation.

B. Section 1330(b) – Alternative Rate Mechanisms

Pennsylvania American agrees with the Commission's interpretation of Section 1330(b)(1) requiring public utilities to file a Section 1308(d), 66 Pa. C.S. § 1308(d), in order to request Commission approval of an alternative rate or rate mechanism so long as the public utility is not required to refile an already Commission approved alternative rate or rate mechanism.

C. Section 1330(c) – Customer Notice

Pennsylvania American supports the Commission's proposed revision to the notice language provided for in 52 Pa. Code § 53.45(b)(1)(i). Additionally, Pennsylvania American agrees with the Commission proposed requirement to provide bill inserts as provided for in 52 Pa. Code § 53.45(4). However, Pennsylvania American requests the Commission consider permitting the use of a direct mail to customers in lieu of bill inserts. The direct customer mailer would include the prescribed information.

With regard to the proposal to post the notice on the public utility website as well as provide a link to the notice on the public utility customer and customer class designated home page, Pennsylvania American agrees with the proposal.

D. Section 1330(d) - Commission

Pennsylvania American agrees that base rate proceedings before the Commission include an in-depth review and examination of a public utility's financial status and operations. The information a public utility is required to submit as part of a base rate proceeding is detailed and comprehensive. As such, no additional filing requirements are needed in order to implement Section 1330.

With regard to alternative rate mechanisms involving annual reconciliation or

adjustments, the Commission decided it will not propose additional procedures and

Pennsylvania American agrees with the Commission's decision

III. **CONCLUSION**

Pennsylvania American appreciates the opportunity to provide comments on the proposed

implementation of Section 1330 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. § 1330, and looks forward

to reviewing the written comments filed in this proceeding.
