FURTHER PREHEARING CONFERENCE MEMORANDUM OF THE BOROUGH OF INDIANA

AND NOW COMES, The Borough of Indiana ("Indiana"), pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.222(d) and in compliance with the Prehearing Order of the Honorable Administrative Law Judge Mary D. Long (the "Administrative Law Judge" or "ALJ"), dated September 5, 2018, to file this Further Prehearing Conference Memorandum in the above-captioned matter. In support thereof, Indiana states as follows:

I. INTRODUCTION AND PROCEDURAL HISTORY

- 1. Indiana is a borough located in Indiana County, Pennsylvania. It provides wastewater service to the public for compensation inside the borough limits and in White Township, Indiana County.
- 2. On June 28, 2018, Indiana filed proposed Supplement No. 11 to Sewer Pa. P.U.C. No. 1 ("Supplement No. 11"), to be effective September 1, 2018. If the proposed tariff supplement

becomes effective, Indiana will benefit from an opportunity to recover an estimated annual increase in base rate revenues of \$880,920 from its customers. Of this amount, \$390,062 is attributable to customers outside Indiana. Indiana also filed the supporting data required by 52 Pa. Code § 53.52.

- On July 31, 2018, the OCA filed a formal complaint against the proposed increase in rates and a Notice of Appearance.
- 4. On August 16, 2018, counsel for the Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement ("I&E") entered her Notice of Appearance.
- 5. By Order entered August 23, 2018, the PUC suspended Supplement No. 11 by operation of law until April 1, 2019, unless otherwise directed by Order of the Commission.
- 6. Indiana, OCA and I&E agreed to enter into mediation in order to resolve this proceeding.
- 7. The ALJ issued her Prehearing Conference Order on August 29, 2018 notifying the parties that a Prehearing Conference was scheduled for Wednesday, September 5, 2018 at 9:00 a.m.
- 8. In compliance with the Commission's Order of August 23, 2018, and due to the parties' agreement to engage in mediation, on September 4, 2018, Indiana filed Supplement No. 12 to Sewer-PA P.U.C. No. 1, suspending the rates in Supplement No. 11 until June 1, 2019.
- 9. A Prehearing Conference was held in this matter on September 5, 2018. The ALJ issued her Prehearing Order on September 5, 2018 to memorialize the matters decided and agreed-upon by the parties.
- 10. At this time, Indiana is not aware of any *pro se* complainants or any other parties to this proceeding other than Indiana, I&E and OCA.

II. STATUS OF NEGOTIATIONS

11. The parties attended a mediation session on September 25, 2018. Since that date, the parties have continued their settlement discussions. Although the parties have made considerable progress, they have not yet reached an agreement. Indiana is open to continuing settlement discussions as the case moves forward.

III. LITIGATION SCHEDULE

- 12. Indiana is not aware of any substantial interest in conducting a public input hearing in Indiana's service territory.

- 14. The subject matters listed below represent as complete a statement of issues and sub-issues as Indiana can provide at this stage of the proceeding. Further definition of contested issues by the parties will develop within the scope of the subject matters listed below during the course of the proceeding. As an overview of its case-in-chief, Indiana posits that the rate proceeding contains the following issues for which it has the burden of proof and which will be addressed in direct testimony:
 - (a) Rate base;
 - (b) Revenues;

- (c) Expenses;
- (d) Rate of return;
- (e) Rate structure; and
- (f) Quality of service.
- 15. To address the above noted issues, Indiana presently intends to offer the following witnesses to testify in this proceeding on the following general subject matters:

19. Indiana remains open to a reasonable settlement of this proceeding.
