**PIKE COUNTY LIGHT & POWER COMPANY'S EIGHTH MONTHLY STATUS
REPORT ON IMPLEMENTATION OF ELECTRONIC DATA INTERCHANGE**

Pursuant to the Commission's March 15, 2018 Order¹ in this proceeding, Pike County Light & Power Company (Pike) submits this status report regarding implementation of Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) capability.

PRIOR REPORTS

In Pike's previous reports, it has documented the steps taken to analyze what Pike would need to do to implement EDI. In its Fifth Status Report, Pike indicated the costs of implementing EDI likely outweigh the benefits.

In its Sixth Status Report, Pike reported the following. On September 7, 2018, Pike filed its Cost Benefit Analysis regarding EDI implementation. Pike also indicated that it will file a request for waiver of EDI requirements and other related waivers by September 28, 2018. On September 10, 2018, Pike created a Business Drop Box account and website to exchange customer files securely at an annual cost of \$1,200.00. Pike also completed setup of three additional internal folders, one for each active EGS on Pike. Next week, Pike will test secure access to each folder to ensure parties cannot access without the required password. Once testing

is completed and site security confirmed, Pike will contact each EGS to review operation of the site. Pike will also establish an automated notification process to notify participants when a file has been uploaded for review.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

On September 28, 2018, Pike filed the above-reference Petition for Waiver regarding EDI. Pike is also addressing EDI issues in the context of its current default service provider plan proceeding.
