PIKE COUNTY LIGHT & POWER COMPANY'S TENTH MONTHLY STATUS REPORT ON IMPLEMENTATION OF ELECTRONIC DATA INTERCHANGE

Pursuant to the Commission's March 15, 2018 Order¹ in this proceeding, Pike County Light & Power Company (Pike) submits this status report regarding implementation of Electronic Data Interchange (EDI) capability.

PRIOR REPORTS

In Pike's previous reports, it has documented the steps taken to analyze what Pike would

need to do to implement EDI. In its Fifth Status Report, Pike indicated the costs of implementing

EDI likely outweigh the benefits.

In its Sixth Status Report, Pike reported that on September 7, 2018, Pike filed its Cost

Benefit Analysis regarding EDI implementation.

In its Seventh and Eighth Status Reports, Pike reported that it had filed a petition for waiver

of EDI requirements and other related waivers on September 28, 2018.

In its Ninth Status Report, Pike reported that on November 30, 2018, Administrative Law Judge Cheskis issued a recommended decision² approving a Joint Petition for Settlement of all

parties to Pike's Default Supply Procurement Proceeding. That Settlement contains a provision where the Parties (Pike, OCA, OSBA, and Direct Energy) will engage in a collaborative regarding EDI issues. The Parties requested in the Settlement that Staff from the Office of Competitive Market Oversight facilitate the collaborative.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

On December 27, 2018, Pike filed a request to hold in abeyance its petition for waiver at Docket No. P-2018-300565 pending the outcome of Pike's default service plan proceeding at Docket No. P-2018-3002709 discussed above.
