REGULAR MEETING

The Meeting was opened with the Pledge to the Flag

PRESENTATIONS

Agreed Upon Services Report on the Operation of the Reading Country Club

Amanda Bernard, Maillie LLP, presented a summary of the firms report on the operations of the Reading Country Club.

Mr. Cortes gave a background report on the use of General Obligation Bonds and requirements for the use of proceeds as a result of the issuance of bonds. The matter was discovered by the Board of Supervisors during the previous report on the use the proceeds of the bonds. There were questions by the Board on the amount of the debt issued and the losses incurred at the Reading Country Club.

Marc Stein, Eckert Seamans, and Robert Tuteur, Eckert Seamans as well reviewed the bond documents from 2005 bond issue and stated that the potentially misuse of the funds of that issue carried through to the subsequent refinancing of that issue.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Agenda Items

Charles Wilson, 28 East 38th Street, stated that he would be willing to work with the Board with respect to the ongoing management concerns at the Reading Country Club.

Sherrie Greene, 1001 Vista Lane, stated that the second half of the video from the last meeting was not

on the website. She expressed her concerns with respect to the current ambulance provider as they do not take subscription services. Recently a resident paid \$275 for an ambulance service. She expressed her concern about outsourcing jobs at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Keith Golembiewski, 4540 Green Tree Road, stated that he supported several of the issues articulated by Sherrie Greene.

Pete Gipprich, 18 Golf View Lane, expressed his concerns about potential development on holes 12 and 13 at the Reading Country Club.

Dorothy Reilly, 13 Craig Drive, stated her objection to the potential sale of the Wastewater Treatment System, especially to PA American.

Glen Hoover, 101 Andes Acres, Birdsboro, stated his objection to the potential removal of the barriers along Route 422.

Sherry High, 28 Ironstone Drive, questioned the improvements at the Exeter Commons Shopping Center. It was her understanding that the work was paid by the Township although it was on private property.

Mr. Rogosky stated that the work is being undertaken by the owner of the property at their decision. They are replacing the corrugated metal pipe (CMP) storm drainage system that was installed when the project was approved. It was the engineer's recommendation at that time not to install the CMP. The work should be completed by the end of June this year.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that this property owner is making TIF payments. The TIF payments go to the state to repay the cost the state incurred in making improvements to the roadway network. No additional tax funds by residents are supporting the costs necessary to support this development.

Charles Wilson, 28 East 38th Street, stated that he did not support the potential sale of the Wastewater System.

Keith Golembiewski, 4540 Green Tree Road, stated that American Water would increase the rates at any time.

Mr. Cortes stated that PA American is regulated by PUC who would approve rates periodically.

Terry Reilly, 13 Craig Drive, asked the basis for the 2.75 million dollars to be defeased.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that the Board engaged Maillie LLP to undertake a forensic audit of the Reading Country Club. This audit confirmed that several expenditures did not conform with the bond documents. Because of this, the Township needs to defease the debt.

Norman Willig, 1474 Fairview Street, asked about the status of the incentive payments to the volunteer fire police.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that the payments will be expedited as soon as possible.

MOTION of Mr. Lloyd, seconded by Mr. Speece, the Board accepted the Treasurer's Report February 2018 subject to audit.

Disbursements

MOTION of Mr. Cusatis, seconded by Mr. Speece, the Board approved payment of the bills presented on the Disbursements List dated April 18, 2018 in the amounts of \$113,866.20 in the General Fund; \$16,244.54 in the Utility Fund; \$7,630.08 in the K9 Fund; \$94,107.31 in the Sewer Fund; \$5,281.26 in the Golf Fund; \$3,093.77 in the RCC F&B Fund; \$4,179.73 in the Capital Projects – GOB 2009 Fund; \$15,382.86 in the Capital Improvement Fund; \$11,495.09 in the State Liquid Fuels Fund.

OLD BUSINESS

Adopt Resolution Authorizing the Defeasing of at least \$2,750,000 of Debt Authorized by Ordinance Dated November 2, 2015

Robert Tuteur, Eckert Seamans, reviewed the process to defease \$2,750,000 of General Obligation Debt. The Board would need to create an escrow account with sufficient funds to pay off that portion of the debt.

Mr. Cortes stated that the Board had two (2) options which would be to defease the debt using existing funds or to borrow additional capital to reduce the debt.

Mr. Granger stated that the Administration would recommend that the Board borrow additional funds as cash on hand could be used to secure additional grant funding for the Township. If the Township were to use \$3,000,000 of existing cash to repay the debt, the Township could potentially lose up to \$7,000,000 in grant funding over the years.

Following a brief discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to direct the Administration and Special Counsel to prepare the ordinances and necessary documents to borrow sufficient funds to defease \$2,750,000 in General Obligation Debt authorized by Ordinance dated November 2, 2015.

Adopt Resolution Authorizing Use of Portion of Certificate of Deposit for Defeasing Debt

This matter was tabled.

The meeting recessed at 7:58 p.m. and reconvened at 8:22 p.m.

Approve/Reject the Proposal for Wastewater System

Dorothy Reilly, 13 Craig Drive, stated that she was not in favor of the sale of the Wastewater System.

Mr. Lloyd does not support the sale of the system. He felt that the operations of the Treatment Plant could be more effectively managed. He believes it is okay to raise real estate taxes to support the operations of the Township rather than have some of those operations supported by Wastewater System.

Mr. Speece stated that the sale of the Wastewater System would stabilize the real estate taxes approximately ten (10) years. He felt it was a very tough decision to make for the residents of the community.

Mr. Cusatis stated that the proposal made by the Administration to enact the Homestead Exemption and other actions would minimize the impact of a sale on residents. He felt it was important to stabilize the real estate taxes in the Township.

Mr. White stated that it was important to monetize the Wastewater Treatment Plant. It was smart to raise the sewer rates to recoup additional capital from the sale.

Mr. Speece asked whether or not the Board would offer a separation bonus to the employees if a sale was to be made.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that this was the toughest decision the Board had to face in many years. Residents are concerned about the loss and control however the rates will increase regardless who owns the Wastewater System. She has a concern that if the system is not managed properly the Township would need to replace a significant portion of the equipment before the debt is paid off.

The Board recessed at 9:42 p.m. and reconvened at 9:44 p.m.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that they started the process of the potential sale anticipating a sale value of approximately \$60,000,000. After Act 12 became effective in 2016 the regulations changed significantly which resulted in a significant increase in the value of the system.

Mr. Cortes stated that Act 12 changed the way in which facilities are valued and increased the value of the wastewater systems. It also permitted the PUC to approve the sale of wastewater systems.

Mr. Cortes stated that the Board had considered a proposal of Bucks County Water and Sewer Authority as well. The Authority submitted three (3) alternatives, alternative one (1) in the amount of \$34,000,000, alternative two (2) in the amount of \$30,000,000 and alternative three (3) in the amount of \$36,000,000.

MOTION of Mr. Lloyd, seconded by Mr. Speece, the Board unanimously rejected all proposals from Bucks County Water and Sewer Authority.

Ms. VanderLaan asked whether or not all the issues have been addressed in the Asset Purchase Agreement with PA American.

Mr. Cortes stated that he is comfortable with the Asset Purchase Agreement and recommended should the Board approve the sale, it should be subject to review by the Solicitor.

MOTION of Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Speece, the Board approved the Asset Purchase Agreement as submitted by PA American for the acquisition of the Wastewater System subject to review and approval by the Township Solicitor.

Roll call vote ensued with Mr. Cusatis voting yes, Mr. Lloyd voting no, Mr. White voting yes, Mr. Speece voting yes and Ms. VanderLaan voting yes.

MOTION of Mr. Speece, seconded by Mr. Cusatis, the Board unanimously authorized Gannett Fleming Inc. to finish the work necessary to complete the transaction.

Authorize Advertisement of Public Hearing for the Park and Recreation Master Plan

Mr. Granger stated that the last step to prior adoption of Plan is a public hearing. He recommended that the Board schedule public hearing for May 29, 2018.

MOTION of Mr. Cusatis, seconded by Mr. Speece, the Board unanimously authorized the advertisement of the public hearing for May 29, 2018.

NEW BUSINESS

Accept Planning Commission Annual Report

The Board accepted the annual Planning Commission Report with thanks.

Approve Contract with Urban Partners in the amount of \$43,700 to Further Develop Conceptual Zoning in Proposed Town Commons District

Following a brief discussion, the Board directed the Administration to seek a phased program to implement this work.

Approve Contract with McMahon Associates for Conceptual Design along Route 422 to Remove Barrier in the Amount of \$50,780

The Board tabled this matter.

Authorize Purchase of Server in Police Department from Lynx in the Amount of \$23,960.75. This is a COSTARS Contractor.

The Board deferred this matter.

Adopt Resolution to Modify the Cost of the Business Privilege License Fee for Owners of Multiple Businesses

Mr. Granger stated that a number of individuals own several businesses in the Township. The current language requires each business to obtain a license. The Special Counsel stated that the Township could modify regulations which would require each individual business owner to secure one (1) license for all

of the businesses that that individual owned. The proposed resolution would allow that going forward. This would be effective January 1, 2019.

MOTION of Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Speece, the Board unanimously adopted the Resolution modifying the cost of Business Privilege License Fee for owners of multiple businesses.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Deputy Chief Harley provided to the Board his March Report and stated that in 2017 the department issued 1,900 tickets. As of March, of this year, the department issued 956.

ENGINEER REPORT

Mr. Rogosky stated that he attended a preconstruction meeting for the Perkiomen Avenue Project on April 16, 2018. PennDOT indicated that the project would be completed in October of 2019.

Mr. Rogosky stated there was no change in the status of the Norfolk Southern Project.

Ms. VanderLaan asked whether or not the Township has approached the owner of the trash business whether or not they could relocate several trash trucks on the other side of Perkiomen Avenue. Mr. Cortes indicated that he would report on this matter at the next meeting.

Sharleen Bender, 30 Hearthstone Drive, asked who decided on the detour for the closure of the tunnel would be on Hearthstone Drive. She stated that on numerous occasions, trash trucks would be driving on Hearthstone Drive at 4:15 a.m. and as late 8:20 p.m. in the evening. She believed that this was a danger to the community and requested the Board's help on this matter.

Ms. VanderLaan stated that when this detour was put in place, the Township felt that it would be a short-term issue. However, the result of the work done by Norfolk Southern and their reluctance to meet with the Township to discuss the matter resulted in a project of significant length. The Board is very concerned about this matter and is attempting to have the trash truck operator relocate certain number of the trucks to the other side of the Perkiomen Avenue.

SOLICITOR REPORT

Mr. Cortes stated that the Board met in Executive Session to discuss potential litigation at the Reading Country Club, personnel matters and potential tax assessment appeal.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Bonnie Hafer, 170 Walnut Road, she stated that she felt she was being harassed by neighbors. She asked what they could do on this matter.

Mr. Cortes stated that if they felt in danger, they should call the Police Department.

Mr. White reported on volunteers cleaning the roads.

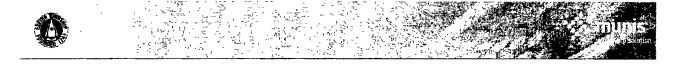
