# MOTION OF THE OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE TO EXPEDITE DISCOVERY

The Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) files this Motion to Expedite Discovery (Motion) in the above captioned proceeding because of the expedited nature of a Section 1329 proceeding.

On September 25, 2018, Pennsylvania-American Water Company (PAWC or Company) filed an Application under Sections 1102 and 1329 of the Public Utility Code seeking Public Utility Commission (Commission) approval of the acquisition of Exeter Township's (Township) sewer system and the right of PAWC to provide wastewater service in the areas served by the Township and approval of the ratemaking rate base of the assets as determined under Section 1329(c)(2) of the Public Utility Code. By Secretarial Letter dated October 1, 2018, the Commission notified PAWC that the Application was not accepted for filing purposes because it was incomplete. On December 5, 2018, PAWC filed an Amended Application to address the issues raised by Commission staff. On December 14, 2018, the OCA filed a Petition to Reject or Hold In Abeyance The Application. By Secretarial Letter dated December 19, 2018, the

Commission conditionally accepted the Amended Application with a condition requiring individual notice to be provided to PAWC's existing water and wastewater customers and that PAWC was to ensure that concurrent notice was provided to all current Exeter Township wastewater customers, along with newspaper notice in the Exeter Township area. Upon completion, PAWC was directed to file a verification that the notice has occurred.

The Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (I&E) filed Motion to Reject or Hold In Abeyance on December 20, 2018. On January 4, 2019, the Borough of St. Lawrence filed a Petition to Intervene. The OCA filed a Protest and Public Statement on January 14, 2019 and a Petition for Stay. By Secretarial Letters dated February 8, 2019, the Commission informed OCA and I&E that the docket was inactive.

On April 15, 2019, PAWC filed a letter, with an attached verification, stating that it had complied with the notice requirements contained in the December 19, 2018 Secretarial letter. By Secretarial Letter dated April 16, 2019, the Commission informed PAWC that it had accepted the Application for filing. Notice of a prehearing conference was served on April 17, 2019.

Section 1329 requires a Commission Order within six months of the acceptance of an Application. In its Section 1329 Implementation Order, the Commission stated, "normal time lines must be compressed." Implementation of Section 1329 of the Public Utility Code, Docket No. M-2016-2543193, slip op. at 32 (Order entered October 27, 2016). The parties must file testimony on an expedited basis, and in order to provide that testimony, a modification to the Commission's discovery rules is appropriate. Pursuant to Commission regulations, answers to discovery are due within twenty days of service. 52 Pa. Code § 5.342(d). Similar modifications have been used in earlier Section 1329 proceedings. The OCA proposes the following modifications to the discovery regulations:

- a. Answers to written interrogatories shall be served in-hand within five (5) calendar days of service.
- b. Objections to interrogatories shall be communicated orally within two (2) calendar days and in writing within three (3) calendar days of service of the interrogatories.
- c. Motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories shall be filed within two (2) calendar days of service of the written objections.
- d. Answers to motions to dismiss objections and/or direct the answering of interrogatories shall be filed within two (2) calendar days of service of such motions.
- e. Responses to requests for document production, entry for inspection, or other purposes must be served in-hand within five (5) calendar days.
- f. Requests for admissions will be deemed admitted unless answered or denied within three (3) calendar days of service.
- g. Discovery and all discovery-related pleadings, such as objections, motions, or answers, served after 12:00 noon on a Friday or after 12:00 noon the day before a holiday recognized by the Commission will be deemed to have been served on the following business day for purposes of tracking due dates.

In prior Section 1329 cases, the OCA's direct testimony was due between four to six days after the prehearing conference. A ruling on the OCA's Motion is necessary before the prehearing conference currently scheduled for May 17, 2019. Therefore, the OCA requests a ruling on an expedited basis so that the case can progress in the limited period available for

litigation. The OCA has been in contact with counsel for I&E and is authorized to state that I&E supports the OCA's Motion and request for an expedited ruling.

WHEREFORE, the Office of Consumer Advocate respectfully requests that the discovery rules be modified as set forth above and that these modifications be applied to discovery that has been sent on this same day and all discovery going forward. In addition, the Office of Consumer Advocate respectfully requests that the Office of Administrative Law Judge rule on this motion in an expedited manner for the reasons set forth above.
