EXETER TOWNSHIP'S REPLY TO THE OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE'S EXCEPTIONS

Exeter Township ("Exeter"), by and through its counsel, pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.535, hereby submits this Reply to the Exceptions of the Office of Consumer Advocate ("OCA").

I. INTRODUCTION

OCA's Exceptions pertain to the Recommended Decision issued by Administrative Law Judge Andrew M. Calvelli, which recommended that the Public Utility Commission ("PUC") approve the sale of Exeter's wastewater system ("System") to Pennsylvania-American Water Company ("PAWC"), as modified by the Joint Petition for Approval of Partial Settlement.

OCA's Exception No. 2 suggests that the adequacy and sufficiency of the consumer notice is a contested issue. Although Exeter does not concede that the consumer notice issued in March/April of 2019 was inadequate and/or insufficient, when viewed as a whole with the subsequent notice issued in July of 2019, PAWC and Exeter have satisfied the legally required element of notice.

II. ARGUMENT

Notice is a legally required element for approval of the sale of the System. *McCloskey v. Pa. Pub. Util. Comm'n*, 1624 CD 2017 (Pa. Cmwlth. 2018), *pet. for alloc. denied*, 743 MAL 2018 (April 23, 2019) ("*New Garden*"). As a result, in compliance with the Secretarial Letter dated December 19, 2018 and the Final Supplemental Implementation Order entered on February 28, 2019, individualized customer notices of the proposed acquisition were provided in March of 2019. PAWC also published notice in a newspaper having general circulation in the area of the wastewater system. PAWC subsequently filed a Verification of Compliance with Notice

Requirements on April 15, 2019, verifying both individualized notice and proof of publication in the Reading Eagle. Subsequently, and as part of settlement discussions, PAWC and Exeter issued additional notice to consumers several months later, in July of 2019. The two notices, taken as a whole, have provided adequate notice to consumers.

III. <u>CONCLUSION</u>

For the reasons stated herein, Exeter Township respectfully requests that the PUC adopt the Recommended Decision issued by Administrative Law Judge Andrew M. Calvelli.
