I&E Letter in Support of the County of Delaware's Petition for Stay

Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

The Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement ("I&E") is in receipt of the County of Delaware, Pennsylvania's ("County") Petition for a Stay of the above-referenced Section 1329 Application for Aqua's Acquisition of the Delaware County Regional Water Quality Control Authority's Wastewater System Assets ("DELCORA"), which was filed on August 7, 2020. The County's Petition indicates that an action is currently pending in the Court of Common Pleas of Delaware County which, *inter alia*, could result in the termination of DELCORA, the named seller in Aqua's Application. According to the County's Petition, final hearings in the Delaware County case are not set to conclude until October 21, 2020; however, a Prehearing Conference for Aqua's instant application is set before Administrative Law Judge Angela T. Jones on September 2, 2020. Each anticipates that absent the Commission's grant of the County's Petition, it is likely that parties involved in Aqua's Application proceeding will be subject to engaging in discovery, serving written testimony, and litigating the merits of the Application prior to the conclusion of the Delaware County court case. impact of this reality appears to be that the parties, the ALJ, and the Commission will expend a great deal of time and resources in litigating and considering Aqua's Application without knowing for certain whether DELCORA has the legal authority to act as the seller of the assets at issue. I&E notes that Section 1329 defines a "Selling utility" as follows: 'a water or wastewater company located in this Commonwealth, owned by a municipal corporation or authority that is being purchased by an acquiring public utility or entity as the result of a voluntary arm's-length transaction between the buyer and seller." Under the facts alleged in the County's Petition, DELCORA's status as a qualifying "selling utility" appears to be in dispute and is now the subject of active litigation.

Given the uncertainty of DELCORA's status, the uncertainty of its authority to convey the assets Aqua seeks to acquire, and the uncertainty of its authority to agree to the terms of the Asset Purchase Agreement that underlies Aqua's Application, I&E supports the County's Petition for Stay for two reasons. First, I&E acknowledges that a threshold question that the Commission must answer in the above-captioned case is whether granting Aqua's Application would affirmatively promote the service, accommodation, convenience or safety of the public in some substantial way and be in the public interest.⁴ I&E submits that it is impossible to make these requisite determinations when both the seller's status and its authority to make the commitments that underly the Asset Purchase Agreement for which Aqua is seeking approval, are uncertain and subject to the outcome of pending litigation. I&E envisions a possibility whereby a Commission-determined public benefit of the transaction may be reversed by a subsequently-issued order of the Delaware County Court. Additionally, I&E agrees with the County that the Commission, the ALJ, and intervenors would be irreparably harmed if they were compelled to litigate Aqua's complex Application, complete with a voluminous record and a truncated statutory timeframe,⁵ subject to the risk of litigation pending in the Court of Common Pleas of Delaware County. Accordingly, I&E writes to convey its support for the County's Petition and respectfully requests that the Commission grant it for the reasons outlined in this letter.

I&E notes that 66 Pa. C.S. § 1329(d)(2) compels the Commission to issue a final order in a Section 1329 proceeding within 6 months of the filing date of an application meeting the requirements of 66 Pa. C.S. §1329 (d)(1). However, I&E submits that the Commission's 6-month obligation is not triggered in this case because DELCORA's status as a "selling utility" under 66 Pa. C.S. §1329 (d)(1) appears to be directly at issue in the pending litigation in the Court of Common Pleas of Delaware County. Accordingly, the threshold determination of whether DELCORA is a "selling utility" cannot yet be established as required to trigger the statutory timeframe.
