PETITION TO INTERVENE OF THE ALLEGHENY COUNTY SANITARY AUTHORITY

Pursuant to Sections 5.71 through 5.74 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("PUC" or "Commission") Regulations, 52 Pa. Code §§ 5.71 - 5.74, the Allegheny County Sanitary Authority ("ALCOSAN") hereby files this Petition to Intervene in the above-captioned proceeding concerning the amended application ("Application" or "Amended Application") of Duquesne Light Company ("Duquesne") seeking Commission approval of the siting and construction of the 138 kV Transmission Lines Associated with the Brunot Island-Crescent Project ("Project"), and a finding and determination that the service to be furnished through Duquesne's

proposed exercise of the power of eminent domain is necessary or proper for the service, accommodation, convenience, or safety of the public.

In support of its Petition to Intervene, ALCOSAN asserts the following:

- The Allegheny County Sanitary Authority is a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania with administrative offices located at 3300 Preble Avenue Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15233.¹ In 1946, ALCOSAN was created under Pennsylvania's Municipal Authorities Act to design, construct, and operate an interceptor system and treatment plant for residential, commercial, and industrial wastewater. ALCOSAN provides wastewater treatment services to 83 communities, including the City of Pittsburgh.
- 2. ALCOSAN has wastewater facilities that are located along portions of the proposed route parallel to Chartiers Creek; accordingly, ALCOSAN has a substantial interest in the outcome of this proceeding.² ALCOSAN is concerned that the PUC's determinations in this proceeding, including approval of the proposed route in the Application, may adversely impact ALCOSAN's existing operations and obligations under a Consent Decree entered into with the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("Consent Decree").³

On April 29, 2019, the Commission directed that dockets A-2019-3008589 and A-2019-3008652 be consolidated for the purposes of discovery, litigation, and decision on Duquesne's Applications for approval of the siting and construction of the Project as well as Duquesne's proposed exercise of the power of eminent domain.

5. On or around August 10, 2020, ALCOSAN received notice from Duquesne of the Amended Application filed by Duquesne in this proceeding.

 On August 24, 2020, Presiding Administrative Law Judge Mary D. Long issued an Interim Order Scheduling a Prehearing Conference on the Amended Application for September 25, 2020 at 10:00 a.m.

7. As a party to a Consent Decree, ALCOSAN must, no later than December 31, 2036, design, construct, and operate conveyance, storage, and treatment facilities for flows from the Regional Collection System in accordance with the planning, design, construction, and operational requirements of the Consent Decree.⁴ In fulfillment of its obligations under the Consent Decree, ALCOSAN has planned the construction and operation of facilities, including planned facilities

along Duquesne's proposed route. ALCOSAN must submit the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System ("NPDES") Part II Water Quality Management ("WQM") application for the Ohio River Tunnel segment and Chartiers River Crossing by January 1, 2022.⁵ Among other deadlines, ALCOSAN must complete preliminary planning and submit a preliminary basis of design report, including a tunnel and consolidation sewer construction schedule, by October 1, 2020.⁶

8. ALCOSAN does not oppose the need for the Project but is concerned that the proposed route of the Project will overlap with ALCOSAN's existing and future wastewater treatment facilities, with potential adverse impacts to safe and reliable operations, the health and safety of the public and the environment, and ALCOSAN's obligations under the Consent Decree. The areas of overlapping facilities occur on pages 21 and 22 of proposed route map that was attached to Duquesne's August 10, 2020 Amended Notice of Filing.

9. ALCOSAN has reached out to Duquesne to discuss ALCOSAN's concerns regarding the proposed route and ALCOSAN's objective and desire to work with Duquesne to ensure that the parties coordinate on the completion of both projects – Duquesne's proposed transmission line and ALCOSAN's planned facilities.
