Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

By Order entered February 25, 2021 in the above-captioned proceeding, the Commission approved the Joint Petition for Non-Unanimous Settlement. On March 5, 2021, Pennsylvania-American Water Company filed with the Commission Tariff Supplement No. 27 to Tariff Water – PA P.U.C. No. 5 ("Compliance Tariff").

Subsequent to the filing of the Company's Compliance Tariff, the Company determined that an agreement between the Company and Bradford Township, dated July 7, 1987 and approved by the Commission at PUC Docket No. U-870592 as part of the Company's acquisition of the Woodland-Bigler Area Authority, limited the rate the Company is permitted to charge Bradford Township to \$75 per year per public fire hydrant ("Approved Agreement"). A copy of the Approved Agreement is attached for reference.

Attached is replacement page, Page No. 32, of the Compliance Tariff which reflects the Bradford Township rate decrease in compliance with the Approved Agreement.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement made this 7th day of July

1987, between Pennsylvania-American Water Company, a Pennsylvania
business corporation with offices at 800 West Hersheypark Drive,
Hershey, Pennsylvania 17033 (hereinafter "Pa-Am") and Bradford
Township, a political subdivision situate in Clearfield County,
Pennsylvania, (hereinafter the "Township").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Pa-Am is an investor owned water utility engaged in the business of providing public water service to communities throughout eastern and central Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, Pa-Am has made a proposal to purchase the Woodland-Bigler Area Water Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "Authority"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority has tentively accepted said proposal to purchase; and

WHEREAS, the Authority provides public water service to a portion of the Township; and,

WHEREAS, in connection with the proposed transaction, Pa-Am and the Township have agreed to enter into this Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein contained, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the parties agree as follows:

- The Township acknowledges that it has no right of first refusal to acquire the Authority's public water supply system.
- The Township has no objection to the Authority selling its public water supply system to Pa-Am.
- 3. In the event Pa-Am acquires the Authority's public water supply system, Pa-Am agrees not to charge the Township, or its supervisors, agents or appointees for the existing forty-four (44) fire hydrants in the Authority's public water supply system for a period of ten (10) years from the date Pa-Am acquires said system.
- 4. With regard to the forty-four (44) fire hydrants in the preceding paragraph of this Agreement, after the ten (10) years has transpired, Pa-Am agrees to limit charges for said hydrants to seventy-five (\$75) dollars per year per hydrant, thereafter in perpetuity, in accordance with the Agreement of April 14, 1987 between the Authority and Township regarding said hydrants.

- 5. This Agreement shall become effective thirty (30) days after the Water Company has filed a copy thereof with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission or, in the event that the said Commission institutes an investigation, at such time as the said Commission grants its approval thereof.
- 6. This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Agreement as of the day and year first above written.

APPLICABILITY

The rates under this schedule apply throughout the territories served under this tariff for service rendered on and after the Effective Date shown at the bottom of this page.

AVAILABILITY

The rates under this schedule are available to customers with applications accepted by the Company under Section 8.5 of this tariff. Service under this classification is subject to regulations set forth in Section No. 8 "Public Fire Hydrants".

RATE

Replacement of existing public fire hydrants with Company owned public fire hydrants will in all circumstances be charged at a rate of \$240.00 per annum or \$20 per month unless stated otherwise below.

The annual charge for each public fire hydrant is \$240.00 per annum or \$20.00 per month except as noted below:

All hydrants added after January 1, 2000, will be billed at 25% of the cost of service or as follows:

\$16.87 per month in 2021 **(D)** \$16.87 per month in 2022.
