Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

Pennsylvania-American Water Company began serving as Receiver (“PAWC-Receiver”) on August 19, 2019, to manage and operate the Indian Springs Water Company (“ISWC”) during the pendency of the Section 529 proceeding at Docket No. M-2019-3011972.

On December 15, 2020, a Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement of All Issues (“Settlement”) between PAWC-Receiver, ISWC, The Glen Summit Company, the Office of Consumer Advocate and the Commission’s Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“Joint Petitioners”) was filed with the Commission.

An Opinion and Order was entered on October 7, 2021 (“Order”) approving the Settlement with a modification to the date permitting customers until April 30, 2022, to drill a well, if necessary. As of November 16, 2021, all customers of ISWC have private wells drilled and are disconnected from the ISWC water system. In response to Ordering Paragraphs 9 and 11 of the Order, PAWC-Receiver is filing the enclosed verified Statement.

Additionally, the Order also required PAWC-Receiver to file a list of amounts paid to each customer of ISWC. As directed by the Order, this information is being provided under confidential cover through the Commission’s Share Point File system.


PAWC-Receiver’s verified Statement and the confidential list of amounts paid to each customer are being provided to each of the Joint Petitioners as directed in Ordering Paragraphs 9 and 10, respectively, as shown on the enclosed Certificate of Service. PAWC-Receiver has confirmed that all checks issued have been cashed.

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The terms of Section III of the Settlement (Settlement Paragraphs 17 through 32) have been complied with and PAWC-Receiver is requesting that the Commission issue a Certificate of Public Convenience evidencing Commission approval of ISWC's abandonment of the provision of water service to the public in Pennsylvania and terminating Pennsylvania-American Water Company's duties and responsibilities as Receiver of ISWC.

STATEMENT

I, Elizabeth Rose Triscari, hereby state that the statements set forth below are true and correct to the best of my knowledge. I understand that the statements herein are made subject to the penalties of 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities).

- a. Pennsylvania-American Water Company, as Receiver, has complied with the terms of the Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement of all Issues to: (i) provide the Customers with a Notice of the Settlement; (ii) provide the Customers with the Offer of a one-time \$5,000 payment as a contribution toward the costs incurred by Customers for drilling private wells; and (iii) provide Customers who did not refuse the Offer with such payment.
- b. All Customers have wells connected to the homes, which are producing water of adequate quality and quantity for domestic use.
- c. The Sale of property owned by Indian Springs Water Company to Glen Summit Land Trust closed on December 21, 2021.
- d. The ISWC System has ceased to operate and all Department of Environmental Protection requirements for abandonment have been complied with.
