RE: Implementation of Chapter 32 of the Public Utility Code regarding The Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority, Second Revised Stage 2 Compliance Plan: Stormwater at Docket Nos. M-2018-2640802 and M-2018-2640803

Dear Attorney Burge:

On October 24, 2022, The Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority (PWSA) filed its Second Revised Stage 2 Compliance Plan: Stormwater (Stormwater Compliance Plan) pursuant to the terms of the Joint Petition for Settlement filed on June 9, 2022 (Joint Settlement), regarding PWSA's January 20, 2022, Stage 2 Compliance Plan: Stormwater Revised, which was approved by Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (Commission) Order entered August 25, 2022, at the above captioned docket numbers. PWSA's Stormwater Compliance Plan appears to comply with the directives of Section III.A.1. of the Joint Settlement.

However, in order for the Commission to keep itself informed of the progress of PWSA's Stormwater Compliance Plan, and pursuant to our authority at Section 504 of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. § 504, we will require PWSA to file the following reports with the Commission at Docket Nos. M-2018-2640802 and M-2018-2640803, with a copy of each provided to the Commission's Bureau of Technical Utility Services:

- (1) The draft PWSA approved Stormwater Strategic Plan defined in the Joint Settlement's Section III.B.1.
- (2) The final PWSA approved Stormwater Strategic Plan upon completion.
- (3) The progress reports on PWSA's stormwater infrastructure development, public engagement plans and other relevant topics, which are to commence no later than three months after PWSA finalizes the Stormwater Strategic Plan as defined in the Joint Settlement's Section III.B.2.a.

If you are dissatisfied with the resolution of this matter, you may, as set forth in 52 Pa. Code §5.44, file a petition for reconsideration from the actions of staff with the Secretary of the Commission within twenty (20) business days from the date of this letter.
