Select Energy

- Select Energy, Inc. (Select) -- competitive subsidiary of Northeast Utilities, the largest energy provider in New England
 - serving CT, MA, & NH with delivery and Provider of Last Resort (POLR) Services
- Select -- major wholesale and retail supplier and energy services provider in the New England, New York, and PJM
 - Currently serving ~ 7000 MW of full requirements load
 - Depth of Experience in various processes to serve POLR loads in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, Maryland
 - Request for Proposals
 - Descending Clock Auctions
 - Bilateral Negotiations



Roundtable Issues

- POLR service should be available to all customers
 - All customers free to choose third party suppliers within EDC guidelines
 - Fixed, market-based prices for small customers
 - For customer classes with the sophistication and expertise to deal directly with third party suppliers either:
 - Real time pricing
 - Short duration fixed market based prices
- EDCs should retain POLR service responsibility
 - EDCs have infrastructure
 - Connection and Delivery Services
 - Customer Care Functions
 - Retail Market Support Functions, etc.



Roundtable Issues

- EDC procurement process for POLR generation supply
 - Open competitive process
 - not an extension of existing settlements
 - One to Three year Term
 - Transactional, for forward market visibility and liquidity
 - Market-based prices for supply will facilitate retail competition
 - Designed for broad based participation with multiple suppliers
 - Ensures diversity of supply and credit support
 - Limits potential impact of supplier default



Select's Suggested Format for Procurement of POLR supply

- Pre-Qualification of bidders, including credit support requirements
- Wholesale supply contracts approved in advance by the PAPUC
- Rules for participation known in advance
- Expedited PAPUC approval of winning bids



Select's Suggested Format for Procurement of POLR supply

A portfolio approach to supply

- E.g., 1/3 sourced for one year, 1/3 for two years, 1/3 for three years
- Benefit: supply reflects current market prices but not locked into what could be historically high prices

Full requirements product

- EDC procures transmission and passes cost through to customers
- Consider NJ BGS auction format
 - model has worked successfully from the NJBPU, EDCs and supplier's perspective
