Formal Complaints filed on 12/16/10, against Verizon Pennsylvania LLC (Verizon PA), Verizon North LLC (Verizon North), MCI metro Access Transmission Services LLC d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services (Verizon Access), and MCI Communications Services Inc. (MCI) (collectively, Verizon) alleging nonpayment by each entity for traffic termination services rendered by Armstrong Telecommunications, Inc. (Armstrong). On 1/10/11, Verizon filed an Answer and New Matter. On 1/31/11, Armstrong filed a Reply to New Matter. Main Briefs and Reply Briefs were filed on 12/6/11 and 1/6/12, respectively, by both Parties. On 2/6/12, the Parties jointly filed a letter notifying the Commission that the Parties resolved all claims set forth in Armstrong's Formal Complaints and Verizon's New Matter with respect to traffic exchanged during periods prior to and including 12/31/11, but not with respect to traffic exchanged after that date. On 2/1/18, both Parties filed Supplemental Briefs. On 10/4/18, the Commission issued the Initial Decision (ID) of ALJ Buckley in which he recommended that Armstrong's Formal Complaints be sustained and that Verizon be assessed a civil penalty of \$1,000. On 11/8/18, Verizon filed Exceptions to the ID. On 11/30/18, Armstrong filed Replies to Exceptions.

The allegations included, *inter alia*, manipulation of equipment temperature indicators, structural gas tank cracks that are not properly repaired, dangerously unmanned plant apparatus, employees handling equipment under the influence, abandonment of work areas, faulty override valves and uncontrolled, unsafe gas migration. The Complainants also alleged racial discrimination in the operation of the plant. On 11/20/19, PGW filed an Answer and Preliminary Objections. By an Order dated 1/3/20, ALJ Heep granted, in part, and denied, in part, the Preliminary Objections. An evidentiary hearing was held on 10/21/20. On 08/13/21, ALJ Heep issued an Initial Decision, which granted, in part, and denied, in part, the Complaint On 9/2/21, PGW filed Exceptions. The Complainants filed Replies to Exceptions on 9/20/21.

Formal Complaint filed on 5/11/20, averring, *inter alia*, that PPL Electric Utilities Corporation (PPL) is overly aggressive in cutting trees and as subsequently amended on 12/14/20, that PPL overcharged in its billing for service to the property. On 6/1/20, PPL filed an Answer, and on 1/4/21, PPL filed an Answer and New Matter to the amendment, denying the substantive allegations as to both its vegetation management and billing practices. A further amended Formal Complaint and further Answer were filed on 6/10/21 and 6/30/21, by the Complainant and PPL, respectively, essentially restating the same substantive claims and denials.
