# Farmhouse Rebuild at Horn Farm Center for Agricultural Education


- \$50,000 grant to rebuild a historic brick farmhouse in an ecologically responsible, energy-efficient way

### 2023 Strategic Planning & Priorities

Held a two-day strategic planning session in October 2022 to identify multi-year priority areas of focus. Priorities align with the Fund's vision and have the greatest opportunity to "move the needle" on a project.

#### 2023-2025 Focus Areas

- 1. Promote and/or enhance community resiliency, sustainable energy communities and buildings, and microgrids.
- 2. Install solar arrays for warehouses and other large existing facilities/buildings.
- 3. Benchmarking to improve programs, policy codes, and other avenues for advocacy.

# 2023 Fund Strategies

#### Program Related Investments (PRIs) – New this year!

- Continuation of funding for building efficiency projects and other clean energy projects through PRIs
- Foresee funding large-scale projects where funds can make a bigger impact, rather than smaller \$25,000-\$50,000 grants
- Finalizing details now but anticipate rolling out this opportunity in early June

#### **Grantmaking in Priority Areas**

- Engage expert consultants and technical service providers to further define the priority areas, design scopes of work, and develop requests for proposals to solicit funding requests.
- Anticipate rolling out grant opportunities as RFPs are developed, beginning this Fall.
