Tariff Water Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 and Tariff Sewer Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 filed on 5/23/24, which proposed an increase in rates. On 11/7/24, Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. and Aqua Pennsylvania Wastewater, Inc. (Aqua), the Commission's Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (BIE), the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA), the Office of Small Business Advocate, and the Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania (CAUSE-PA), filed a Joint Petition for Non-Unanimous Partial Settlement (Joint Petition), which proposed, *inter alia*, an increase in Aqua's annual water revenue by \$48 million for Aqua's water operations and \$25 million for Aqua's wastewater operations. The Joint Petition reserved for litigation Aqua's proposed rate increase as applied to the East Whiteland Township wastewater system and the method of billing requested by SCH USA, LLC (SCH USA). By Recommended Decision (RD) issued on 12/9/24, ALJs Chiodo and Arnold recommended the approval of the Joint Petition, with modifications, and the denial of the issues reserved for litigation. Following the filing of Exceptions and Reply Exceptions, the Commission on 2/7/25 entered an Opinion and Order modifying the RD. On 2/14/25, Aqua filed a Petition for Partial Reconsideration and/or Clarification (Aqua Petition). On 2/24/25, BIE and the OCA filed Answers to the Aqua Petition and CAUSE-PA filed a letter in lieu of an Answer. Also, on 2/24/25, SCH USA filed a Petition for Reconsideration (SCH USA Petition). On 3/4/25, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order via notational vote granting the SCH USA Petition pending further review of, and consideration on, the merits.
