As relief, the Complainant requested that electric service be reconnected to his residence. On 10/26/23, PPL filed an Answer to the FC. A telephonic evidentiary hearing was held on 3/26/24. On 11/6/24, PPL filed a Motion for Summary Judgment. On 12/16/25, the Complainant filed a Motion to Keep Record Open and to Continue Hearings. On 1/2/25, the Commission issued the Initial Decision of ALJ Arnold wherein he denied the Complainant's Motion to Keep Record Open and to Continue Hearings and granted PPL's Motion for Summary Judgment, finding that there are no material facts in dispute and PPL is entitled to judgment as a matter of law. Accordingly, the ALJ dismissed the FC with prejudice. The Complainant filed Exceptions on 1/21/25. PPL filed Replies to Exceptions on 2/3/25.

Tariff Water Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 and Tariff Sewer Pa. P.U.C. No. 4 filed on 5/23/24, proposing an increase of about \$112 million in additional annual water revenue and about \$14.6 million in wastewater revenue, using a fully projected future test year ending 12/31/25. On 11/7/24, Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. and Aqua Pennsylvania Wastewater, Inc. (Aqua), the Commission’s Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (BIE), the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA), the Office of Small Business Advocate, and the Coalition for Affordable Utility Services and Energy Efficiency in Pennsylvania, filed a Joint Petition for Non-Unanimous Partial Settlement (Joint Petition), that proposed, *inter alia*, an increase in Aqua’s annual water revenue by \$48 million and \$25 million for its wastewater operations; as well as reserved for litigation its proposed rate increase for the East Whiteland Township wastewater system and SCH USA, LLC’s (SCH USA) requested method of billing. On 12/9/24, ALJs Chiodo and Arnold, issued a Recommended Decision (RD) approving the Joint Petition, with modifications, and the denial of the issues reserved for litigation. On 12/23/24, Aqua, SCH USA, Mr. Adam J. Shellhorse, and Mr. John Day filed Exceptions. Reply Exceptions were filed by Aqua, BIE, the OCA, and Mr. Shellhorse on 12/30/24. On 2/7/25, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order modifying the RD. On 2/14/25, Aqua filed a Petition for Partial Reconsideration and/or Clarification (Aqua Petition). On 2/24/25, BIE and the OCA filed Answers to the Aqua Petition and CAUSE-PA filed a letter in lieu of an Answer. Also, on 2/24/25, SCH USA filed a Petition for Reconsideration (SCH USA Petition). On 3/6/25, Aqua filed an Answer to the SCH USA Petition. The Commission issued Orders on 2/20/25 and 3/6/25 granting the Aqua Petition and the SCH USA Petition, pending review of, and consideration on, the respective Petitions on their merits.
