On 1/8/20, the Complainants contacted the Commission and requested that the evidentiary hearing be conducted in writing. ALJ Heep granted the Complainants' request for a hearing in writing. The case record closed on 3/22/24. By Initial Decision issued on 6/13/24, ALJ Heep denied and dismissed the FCs. The Complainants filed Exceptions on 6/26/24. Met-Ed filed Replies to Exceptions on 7/15/24. On 4/24/25, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order in this matter. On 5/5/25, the Complainants filed a Petition for Reconsideration. No Answer to the Petition was filed.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Commission adopt the proposed Opinion and Order.
