Informal Investigation instituted on or about 6/15/21, regarding FirstEnergy Pennsylvania Electric Company (West Penn) alleged incident in Washington County, Pa. involving a 7200-volt (phase-to-ground) wire that landed on the carport roof of the residence. On 3/26/24, the Parties submitted a Joint Petition for Approval of Settlement (Settlement) and Statements in Support of the Settlement. By Commission Opinion and Order entered 8/22/24 (August 2024 Order), the Settlement was ordered to be published in the Pa. Bulletin for comments from interested parties. On 9/7/24, the August 2024 Order was published in the Pa. Bulletin with comments to be filed no later than 25 days after publication. No comments were filed by the 10/2/24 deadline. On 4/15/25, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order asking the parties to address several questions to assist the Commission in determining if the Settlement Agreement is in the public interest (April 2025 Order). The April 2025 Order gave the parties 30 days to submit additional information. On 5/15/25, the parties submitted additional information into the record in support of the Settlement Agreement that responded to the April 2025 Order.

NAME AND SUBJECT: SCH USA LLC VS AQUA PENNSYLVANIA WASTEWATER INC
Formal Complaint (FC) filed on 11/21/22, concerning unmetered wastewater service to three separate accounts at three separate service locations. On 11/29/22, SCH USA, LLC (SCH USA) filed an additional FC against Aqua Pennsylvania Wastewater, Inc. (Aqua) concerning unmetered wastewater service to one account at one service location. In both FCs, SCH USA: (1) alleged that Aqua was threatening to, or had already, shut off its service; (2) alleged that Aqua was incorrectly charging for unmetered wastewater service; (3) alleged that Aqua has been unapproachable and has not responded directly to its request to be charged on a metered basis; and (4) requested a payment agreement. On 12/12/22 and 12/27/22, Aqua filed Answers and New Matters to the FCs. On 12/29/22, SCH USA filed a Reply to both New Matters raised by Aqua. A hearing was held on 9/24/24. In an Initial Decision issued on 4/24/25, ALJ Coogan denied both FCs. SCH USA filed Exceptions on 5/14/25. Aqua filed Replies to Exceptions on 5/27/25. On 7/10/25, the Commission entered an Opinion and Order in this matter. On 7/25/25, the Complainants filed a Petition for Reconsideration. No Answer to the Petition was filed. The Commission issued an Opinion and Order to retain jurisdiction of the matter on 7/28/25. On 8/4/25, Aqua filed an Answer to the Petition.

(NRG), and, the Retail Energy Supply Association (RESA). On 9/3/24, the Boroughs amended the Petition to add the Borough of Camp Hill as a Petitioner. On 9/20/24, the Boroughs filed a Restated Petition. On 10/18/24, the OCA, CAUSE-PA, Citizens, Wellsboro, PECO, PPL, NRG and RESA filed Answers to the Boroughs' Restated Petition. On 11/25/24, the Boroughs filed a Memorandum to Show Cause and Motion for Partial Judgment on the Pleadings (the Boroughs' Memo and Motion for PJOP). On 12/23/24, the OCA, the OSBA, CAUSE-PA, Citizens, Wellsboro, DLC, PECO, PPL and NRG filed responses to the Boroughs' Memo and Motion for PJOP. By Initial Decision issued on 3/28/25, ALJ Long denied the Boroughs' Motion for PJOP and denied the Boroughs' Restated Petition. On 4/17/25, the Boroughs filed Exceptions.
