On 7/14/22, PWSA filed an Answer and New Matter and Preliminary Objections (POs) to the FC. On 7/22/22, the Complainant filed an Answer to the POs. On 8/1/22, the Complainant filed a reply to PWSA’s New Matter. On 5/26/23, the Complainant and PWSA each filed a Motion for Summary Judgment. On 7/26/23, the Complainant filed a Motion for Directed Verdict. An oral argument was held on 5/22/24. In an Initial Decision issued on 5/2/25, ALJ DeVoe granted the Complainant’s Motion for Summary Judgment, denied PWSA’s Motion for Summary Judgment, and determined that the Complainant’s Motion for Directed Verdict was moot. The Complainant filed Exceptions on 5/16/25 and PWSA filed Exceptions on 5/22/25. The Complainant filed Replies to Exceptions on 5/30/25 and PWSA filed Replies to Exceptions on 6/2/25.

Additionally, the Commission sought comments on its proposal that NGDCs and smaller natural gas distribution companies that are eligible for a Distribution System Improvement Charge (DSIC) petition the Commission to amend their current long-term infrastructure improvement plans to focus on the replacement of the older plastic pipe that is highlighted in the four advisory bulletins issued by the United States Department of Transportation. Lastly, the Commission proposed that smaller natural gas public utility systems that may not be eligible to use a DSIC but may have aging infrastructure present in their systems file a Pipeline Replacement Plan.
