On 7/1/24, the Office of Consumer Advocate (OCA) filed an Answer to PPL's Petition. On 7/8/24, American Home Contractors, Inc.; Enphase Energy, Inc.; the Solar Energy Industries Association; SolarEdge Technologies, Inc.; Sun Directed; Sunnova, Inc.; Tesla, Inc.; and Trinity Solar, LLC (collectively, the Joint Solar Parties) filed an Answer, Petition to Intervene, and Protest. Evidentiary hearings were held on 2/11/25 and 2/12/25. In a Recommended Decision issued on 6/30/25, ALJ Coogan recommended that the Petition be denied.
